Notes:

- Works Cited page is on its own page (even when it lists only one source)
- Page number of Works Cited page is the last page of your paper--if the content of your paper ends on page 3, then your Works Cited page is page 4
- Font, size, and style of Works Cited page should be the same as the rest of the paper.
- Entire Works Cited page is double spaced with no extra spaces between sources (make sure page formatting is set so that spacing after a return is zero)
- Entries are alphabetized by the author's last name. If a source does not have an author, then it is alphabetized by the first important word in the title (ignore the articles "a," "an," and "the")
- NEVER use numbers or bullet points for the entries on a Works Cited page
- First line of each entry starts on the left margin; all subsequent lines on each entry are indented--this is called a hanging indent is the opposite of a regular paragraph
- Include only sources that you actually cite in your paper
