

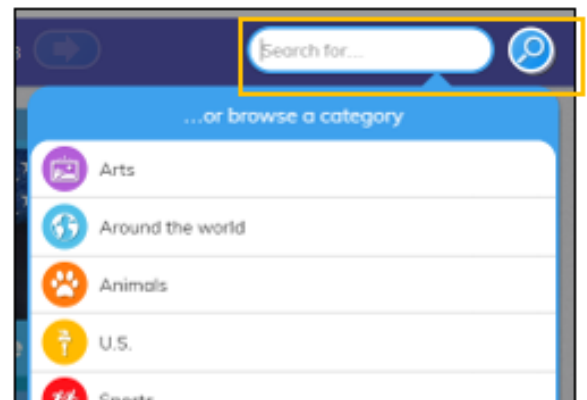
Teaching Media Literacy with myON News

Multi-Media Features That Further Engagement

myON News articles incorporate engaging multimedia to help students better understand the news. Log in to your myON account and navigate to the **News** tab to fully experience an article and its features. Complete steps 1 through 3, and, once all tasks have been completed, answer the final question.

1. Access the searchable archive to find previously published and related news articles.

- Use the keyword text box to search for your own keyword (like "employment") or select by specific category to show all articles in that subject area.
- Choose an article to read.



2. Explore the sidebar options to customize reading experience.

Turn audio on audio and listen to the article read aloud.

Select article text size.

Play embedded video to view a short video related to the subject of the article.

Click this button for an interesting fact about the article's content.

Learn who has written the article and a few details about the author.

Read the sources and references used to create the article, slideshow, and video.

Choose from one of three languages.

View the geographical location of the article, fun facts, and learn how far away the article location is from where you are.

View slideshow of photos with notes on each to give more information.

See a suggestion of an activity you can do in relation to the article.

3. Read the article and take the quiz.

- Select vocabulary words to view definition(s) and hear pronunciation of words.
- Take the quiz.
