The Oregon Statewide Educator Survey, formerly known as the TELL Oregon Survey, was last conducted in 2018 to inform school improvement efforts. It has been redesigned with improved data collection and reporting to be responsive to local and regional needs. This shortened version of the survey was based on input from educators around the state.

The survey is voluntary, confidential and anonymous. It's open to every school-based licensed educator, including teachers, principals, assistant principals, school counselors, social workers and school psychologists. Educators who serve multiple school buildings in the district are encouraged to take the survey for each building they serve.

When the survey opens next Wednesday, your building leadership will provide you with the code you need to access the anonymous survey online. All educators at a school will receive the same access token to ensure anonymity. Results from the survey will only be shared at the school level if there is a 40% completion rate and a minimum of five respondents.
